## What happens when I get there?



No worries. Here's what happens.



If you arrive at Tokyo's Narita International Airport on the official program starting date, a KCP staff member will greet you.

At Narita, you'll first proceed through immigration, collect your luggage, and pass through customs. Stay near the customs exit so that someone from KCP can find you. We'll have a photograph of you.



International flights usually arrive at Narita in the afternoon, between 1 pm/13:00 and 4 pm/16:00. If your flight arrives earlier, please be patient until someone from KCP arrives.

If you can't connect with a KCP staff member, don't panic. Wait 20 minutes, and while waiting, listen to the paging announcements: our staff may be paging you. After 20 minutes, you can either call KCP directly or call your study coordinators' cell phone. You'll have those numbers before you leave the U.S.

When all students have arrived, we usually escort each of you directly to the home of your host family or take you to your dormitory.
